ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS

Annual General Meetings are all now complete (two to be rescheduled) and we would like to thank everyone who took the time to come along and get involved. An honourable mention to the over 70, yes 70 participants of the Super OC AGM which went for 4.5 hours! A great turn out from all OC's and we hope that in future years more and more lot owners get involved and become an active part of their Owners Corporation - team work makes the dream work!

Meeting minutes have already been sent out for some Owners Corporations and others will follow shortly, as per the Owners Corporation Act meeting minutes must be sent within 14 days of the meeting being held.

As there was only one Owners Corporation that achieved a quorum (50% or more of lots represented) all decisions of the Owners Corporation are interim resolutions.

What is an interim resolution? In accordance with the Owners Corporations Act 2006, notice of all interim resolutions and the minutes of the meeting at which the interim resolutions are made must be forwarded to all lot owners within 14 days of the meeting. Interim resolutions become decisions of the Owners Corporation 29 days from the date of the interim resolution, unless notice of a special general meeting is given within that 29-day period.

Once the 29 day interim period has elapsed, our website will be updated with the current Chairperson and Authorised Representatives email addresses for each Owners Corporation.

The email distribution groups for each OC Committee will also be updated and newly appointed committee members will be added, previous committee members removed. We will email each OC Committee as this happens to ensure everyone is receiving the emails as they should. SANCTUARY LAKES PARKS AND BBQ AREAS

With beautiful spring days upon us and restrictions gradually easing, many of us are taking advantage of the beautiful parks, playgrounds, barbeques, and outdoor gymnasia that we have here in Sanctuary Lakes.

Did you know that there are 5 playground areas within Sanctuary Lakes? These are located at:

- St Andrews Park in Gallery Place
- Adventure Playground, on the corner of The Breezewater and Freshwater Point
- Rob Partington Reserve on Sanctuary Lakes Boulevard South (opposite Watersun Court)
- Regatta Cove Reserve on North Shore Drive
- Oyster Bay Park

There are rubbish bins located at the playground areas, as well as elsewhere throughout the Resort so that rubbish can be disposed of appropriately. All rubbish bins around the Resort are emptied by our Resort Maintenance team every Monday and Friday, except on public holidays in which case they are emptied the following business day. We ask that residents do not use the rubbish bins for household waste and should you notice that a rubbish bin is full, we ask that you please take your rubbish home with you to avoid the bins overflowing and making a mess.

There are also multiple doggy bag dispensers and bins located around the Resort to make picking up after your furry friend easy. Please only take one or two bags as required. The doggy bag dispensers are also replaced by our Resort Maintenance team. Please remember all animal waste should be properly disposed of at the home of the pet owner or within specified dog litter bins.

Here at Sanctuary Lakes we also have 3 communal barbeque areas for residents to make use of which are located at:

- Adventure Playground, on the corner of The Breezewater and Freshwater Point
- Rob Partington Reserve on Sanctuary Lakes Boulevard South (opposite Watersun Court)
- Regatta Cove Reserve on North Shore Drive

The barbeque areas are cleaned by our Resort Maintenance team every Monday and Friday as part of the rubbish bin round.

Our Resort Maintenance team work hard to maintain the many parks and garden beds around Sanctuary Lakes, but it is also up to us to clean up after ourselves along with our pets and to dispose of our rubbish appropriately so that everyone can enjoy a clean and healthy environment.

Please note that all playground equipment is owned and maintained by Wyndham City Council, however if you do notice damage to any equipment, please email our office so we can arrange for the area to be made safe and we can also notify Wyndham.

EPA NOISE GUIDELINES

Recently, we have received a number of questions regarding rules around excessive noise throughout Sanctuary Lakes Resort. Noise guidelines are set by the Environmental Protection Authority's Residential Noise Regulations (2018) in line with the Environmental Protection Act 1970.

'Residential noise' is noise coming from a residential property and its surroundings. It can include noise from:

- stereos or radios;
- televisions;
- air conditioners;
- lawn mowers;
- power tools used during home renovations;

• construction of houses and apartments.

Everyday household activities can cause residential noise and disturb neighbours. Noise can be unreasonable if a neighbour can hear it in a habitable room of their home.

Noise is unreasonable when it occurs during prohibited hours and someone in any other residence can hear it. Excessive noise is prohibited between Monday to Friday before 7am and after 8pm, and on weekends and public holidays before 9am and after 8pm. However, residential noise can still be considered unreasonable if it is constant and within the permitted timeframes.

When a noise complaint is made and investigated, a number of factors are taken into consideration when deciding whether the noise is unreasonable.

These are things like:

- it's volume how far the noise spreads;
- it's intensity how loud or how many decibels it is;
- the type of noise and what it sounds like;
- how close it is to neighbours;
- how long it continues;
- how often it occurs.

BEES - BY MARION FLOMM

A little guide to a bee-friendly garden

If you're planning to plant a few new flowers or herbs or vegetables in your garden, why not think about making it also a lot more attractive for all the hard-working native bees and honey bees out there?

Not so different to us, bees love variety. So give them a few different options as to where to do their daily work, like different shapes and colours, but make sure to pick plants that are also suitable for our climate and the soil you'll want to grow them in. And if you want to attract the busy bees all year round, try to select varieties that will flower at any given time across the seasons. Also, for maximum bee attraction, try planting them in groups or clumps.

And since bees prefer sunny places over shady ones, and being sheltered from strong winds (again, not so much different from us), try to find these sweet spots in your garden for your bee-attracting plants.

Here are just a few examples of plants that are suitable for growing around Sanctuary Lakes:

- Flowers

- Herbs

- Glory of the Snow, Snowdrop
- Crocus, Bluebells, Daffodils, Hyacinth, Iris
 Daisies, Sunflowers
- Lavender and Rosemary (both are absolute bee favourites)

- Oregano, Marjoram, Sage (another favourite)

- Lemon Balm
- Flowering Shrubs

- Flowering Trees
- Hibiscus, Showy Banksia, Hairpin Banksia, Grevillea, Bottlebrush

- Lemon Tree, Plum Tree, Persimmon, Apple Tree, Avocado Tree (not that easy to grow, but if you succeed, it's another bee favourite)

- Dryland Tea Tree, Bee Bee Tree (the name says it all)



And of course a variety of different Gum Trees. But if our bees feel like a bit of Eucalyptus, they'll find plenty of that all around Sanctuary Lakes, so why not try to woo them with something different?

Working hard all day in your garden will make the bees thirsty. And here is where they are a little less like us: They prefer their water to be a little slimy and murky, rather than sparkling fresh from the tap. So rather than emptying and re-filling their water source, just top it up, maybe with water from a watering can that has been filled a few days ago. Bees need a safe place to stand when they drink, so avoid steep containers or fast flowing water. Probably the best watering stations for bees are shallow dishes filled with marbles or stones. Or even just a bucket of water with some sticks or anything that floats. Bird baths that are not too steep are also a good idea (and the birds will be happy as well).

And of course, try to avoid any pesticides, as much as you can. The bees (and bugs) will thank you for it.





SLOW DOWN: BACK TO SCHOOL FOR SOME

Some children will be returning to school this week (even with remote learning still in place).

School days bring congestion, school buses are picking up their passengers, kids on bikes are trying to get to school before the bell rings, hurried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work.

It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present – especially before and after school.



Safety tips for drivers:

With hundreds of children returning to school this week, it's critical for drivers to ensure they exercise extreme caution when travelling through school zones.

The following safety tips can easily help:

- Be aware of the placement of schools in your local area so you know when school zones are approaching;
- Remember that children can be unpredictable and misjudge traffic;
- Always stay alert and aware of their movements;
- Remain focused on both the road ahead and pedestrians in your peripheries while travelling through a school zone;
- Constantly check your speed and make sure you stick to the speed limit. A pedestrian hit by a car at 40km/h has 75% chance of surviving. At 60km/h, the survival rate drops to just 15%.

Safety tips for parents and children:

To ensure your child's journey to school is a safe one, keep in mind the following tips:

- Keep your kids close. Children up to 8 years of age should hold an adult's hand on sidewalks, in carparks, and when close to a road;
- Children up to 10 should hold an adult's hand when crossing the road and should be supervised around traffic;
- Teach your children to minimise distractions, such as listening to music in headphones or playing on devices when close to a road;
- Have open and honest conversations about the risks involved in a road traffic environment.

Tractor Edging

Some residents may find that the cut offs have been thrown back onto the nature strip, these will be mulched when the ride on mows the nature strips.

Breezewater Reserve Pathway

We recently received a complaint from a resident regarding the unfinished walkway at Breezewater Reserve.

We contacted Wyndham City Council in relation to this as the reserve is Council property and they advised that the gravel path would be completed once COVID-19 restrictions had lifted.

We are pleased to see that works on the path have now started.

Sea Grass

Over the past fortnight a massive 58.12 tonnes of sea grass was taken to the tip for recycling.

The sea grass is dropped in a special area at the tip which is allocated to Veolia. It is then transported to their recycling plant at Bulla for processing.
