DO I CALL SECURITY OR POLICE?

Security are the first responders to duress alarms, smoke alarms and any call for help from the residents. Their role is to assist residents prior to police, fire brigade and ambulance arriving at the scene. All SLR Security officers have first aid training and carry a defibrillator in their vehicle.

Security's role is to observe and report. They do not have any powers to detain any individual. If you see any illegal behaviour and you feel the police should be in attendance residents are to call police and request attendance immediately. Security will attend and assist in any way they can.

A MESSAGE FROM WYNDHAM POLICE - MONKEY BIKES

What to do when you sight a 'monkey' bike/miniaturised motor bike or dirt bike or bad driving behaviour?

- Urgent - posing a serious risk - 000
- Not urgent - Police Assistance Line - 131444

What Police need:

- Location, nearest cross street, landmark;
- Descriptions;
- Last seen;

What Police can do with the information provided?

1. Police will endeavour to attend the location nominated where the bikes were last seen (important for updates if the riders enter or exit a house). Westgate Highway Patrol also utilise Police dirt bikes and road bikes for patrols that greatly assist in catching offenders with their ability to follow where Police cars are unable to.

2. If Police are unable to attend the location or may attend but do not observe any bikes at the time, an information report will be compiled to help Police build an intelligence database of the bikes, descriptions, riders and locations they attend or live. This especially assists the Highway Patrol and Uniform Police in actively targeting the offenders and may result in an infringement notice or an impound and day at court with relevant charges.

If you wish to report bad driving behaviour anonymously you can also do so by contacting Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

What are monkey/miniaturised motor bikes?

Miniature motorbikes are small motorcycles scaled down to about half the size of a full size motorcycle which are intended, designed and supplied for use other than on a declared road. Miniature motorbikes are not permitted to be registered for use on declared roads as they do not meet the requirements of the Australian Design Rules (ADRs) administered under the Motor Vehicle Standards Act 1989. Under section 65C(1) of the Road Safety 1986 it is illegal to use a miniaturised motor bike on a road or road related area.
