

# PROSPECTIVE RECREATION CLUB DEVELOPMENT LATEST UPDATE

Following the last update provided in the newsletter dated 8/10/2019, SLRS have been assessing various hypothetical alternative options and working on the 'cost of doing nothing' model.

In the last 2 months... to assist in determining the various alternative options, SLRS have been:

- Meeting with our Development Consultant (SMEC) and Architect (BH Architects) to explore
  hypothetical alternative options. Discussions were based on feedback and comments received from
  the initial consultation process in August 2019.
- Developing financial modelling scenarios which have assisted in understanding the various costing and income generating options that could be considered with the Development.
- Developed a list of hypothetical alternative options for further investigation and market testing.

**In the next 2 months...** to finalise the alternative options and kick-off the Focus Group and Public Q&A Sessions. SLRS will:

- Complete the Market Testing, Financial Modelling and work with the Architects to complete the draft designs.
- Release details of the next consultation process for lot owners, which will include Focus Group and Public Q&A sessions.
  - Details of how to register your interest in participating in a Focus Group, will be included in the newsletter dated 14/1/2020.

SLRS continue to focus on finding options that provide the best value for money, the best service offering and offer the best results for all lot owners and residents.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE - NBN**

Have you upgraded to NBN yet? If so, you should have upgraded your alarm system too.

Old alarm communication systems are NOT compatible with NBN and in most cases will stop reporting back to security which includes smoke alarm monitoring.

In addition to this there is a chance that the NBN (if not isolated from the alarm panel itself) can cause the alarm to short circuit resulting in an additional cost to the owner – repair costs can be up to \$1,000.

#### **Sea Grass**

Over the past fortnight the lake crew removed 7.12 tonnes of sea grass from the lake.

The sea grass is dropped in a special area at the tip which is allocated to Veolia. It is then transported to their recycling plant at Bulla for processing.



Every Friday we rake all the beaches in the Resort, we remove all the sea grass that may have built up over the week as well as clear away any rubbish.
